# THE KEY **SPEAKERS**



**Louise Minchin** is a well-known and respected broadcaster and journalist. Louise presented BBC Breakfast on BBC One for 20 years. Before this she presented various programmes on BBC Radio Five Live and was one of BBC News 24's main anchors. Louise presents and has appeared on a host of programmes for the BBC, ITV and Channel 4 including The One Show, Real Rescues, Missing Live, Crime & Punishment and Time Crashers. More recently, she presented Tonight: The Truth About Stalking, entered the Welsh castle for I'm a Celebrity Get Me Out of Here and came runner up in Celebrity MasterChef. She is the host of the top-rated podcast series, Push Your Peak in which Louise meets

people who have done superhuman things, to learn what it mentally and physically takes to accomplish.

Louise's passion is endurance sport. Having given up the sport as a teenager, after a BBC Breakfast Christmas cycling challenge she was inspired to attempt her first triathlon in 2013 and went on to qualify for the GB Team age-group team to race in Chicago in 2015. Since then she has raced in five World and European Championships and competed in extreme triathlons including one of the toughest triathlons in the world, Norseman in 2019. In 2020 Louise took part in a 100-mile hike across the Namibian desert for Sport Relief raising awareness of mental health.



**Nahla Summers** is a cultural change consultant, adventurer, keynote speaker, Point of Light award winner, inspiring author, and the driving force behind 'A Culture of Kindness' and 'Sunshine People'. Her story has been inspiring people around the world. 'A Culture of Kindness' is about the theory of bringing kindness into the workplace to be happier and improve wellbeing but also be more productive and therefore profitable.

Using the theory and training program, Nahla and her team transform organisations to ones with higher productivity, improved employee retention, engagement and reduced stress and anxiety in the workplace.

Through her talks, she inspires a mindset of positive change in her audiences and organisations.



**Christoph Geppert** started his career in design getting an extensive insight into product and brand development and the strategies that underpin the success of projects. Nowadays, he focuses on the evolution and implementation of sustainability strategies across a broad range of industries from education, building and manufacturing to finance, professional services and software.



**Elena Lai** is Secretary General at ETSA. With a strong focus on public affairs and networks development, she has excellent lobbying, networking and negotiation skills across business development and management. Elena possesses a high level of expertise on media, communication and digital areas applied to a wide range of sectors, including EU funding and projects for established and new companies both large and small.
